


1 Manner of Anthony Van Dyck, Portrait of Katherine Percy (1630-38), daughter of Algernon Percy, 10th Earl of Northumberland, a lozenge of the Stuart Royal coat of arms upper right, oil on canvas, (possibly 19th century), 76 x 64 cm, framed 92 x 78.5 cm

The portrait derives from a corner of a family portrait group of the Earl with his wife and daughter now at Petworth House. £400-600

A 19th century Italian style giltwood console table, the variegated red marble top over a foliate scroll carved frieze on cabriole shaped carved legs with scroll feet, joined by scroll carved stretchers, 124.5 wide, 76cm deep, 77 cm high £300-500



A William IV mahogany extending dining table, the rectangular top with three extra leaves over a moulded frieze and turned reeded tapering legs, 342 cm extended, 139.5 cm wide, 74 cm high. £600-800

A George III oak kneehole desk, the top with indented corners above a long drawer and a kneehole with a shaped shelf flanked by three graduated drawers on either side on bracket feet, 82 cm wide, 53 cm deep, 77 cm high £150-250



A long oak vernacular stool, the planked seat on adzed legs with turned stretchers, one leg stamped 'EW', 244 cm long, 29 cm deep, 57 cm high £200-300



A pair Louis XV style kingwood and gilt-metal mounted bedside nightstands, French, late 19th century, the variegated rouge marble inset serpentine tops, above two drawers, raised on serpentine legs with platform stretchers and casters, 40 cm wide, 83.5 cm high, 37 cm deep. £200-300



A 19th century French ash kitchen table, the rectangular top over a frieze drawer to one side on square section tapering legs, 150 cm wide, 75 cm deep, 75 cm high £300-500



A Victorian oak snaptop centre table, the circular top with radiating veneers over a turned stem on tripod cabriole legs with carved cabochon and paw feet, 122 cm diameter, 72 cm high £100-150





A George III figured walnut bureau, the drop front opening to reveal a compartmentised interior, over two short and two long graduated drawers, on bracket feet, lacking key, 104 cm high x 91 cm wide x 51 cm deep. £200-300



A pair of tall Neoclassical patinated bronze braziers, the circular pans over ram's head and swag decoration, on four tapering legs, terminating on claw feet, standing on a sqaure base, 110 cm high. £600-800



An early 20th century large travelling standing wardrobe, by Albert Rosenhain (Berlin), with domed top and leather carry handles, fitted compartments to the interior, 150 cm high x 72 cm x 57 cm. £150-250



A near pair of 19th century French ebonized Boulle bonheur du jour, galleried top, with two cupboard doors over two drawers, a lower drawer opening to reveal a morrocco gilt-tooled red leather scriber on slide, (on one of them, the other has a plain slide), the base on cabriole legs, 132 cm x 73 cm x 50 cm. An oak vernacular drop leaf table, the oval hinged top on fret carved splat style supports, joined by planked stretchers, parts 18th century, 116 cm open, 101 cm wide, 68.5 cm high £100-150



An Italian mahogany reverse breakfront bookcase, late 19th century, the cornice with scroll and turned ornament and two arched pediments with eagles head crests, above four glased doors enclosing adjustable shelves, the base with four cupboards with cartouche panels, 270cm high x 275cm wide x 42cm deep. £200-400



A late George III style mahogany serpentine sideboard, with satinwood crossbanding and boxwood stringing, the central freize drawer flanked by deep drawers on square section tapering legs and spade feet, 107 cm wide, 50.5 cm deep, 84 cm high £60-80



A large and impressive silvered circular meat trolley, early 20th century, the domed top with twin sliding doors, the legs formed as lions, fitted to a wheeled circular base, 110 cm x c. 75 cm. £500-700



A 19th century oak lambing chair, with panelled back and seat supports, 121 cm high £150-250





A pair of Italian style giltwood side chairs, possibly 19th century, the red damask upholstered backs and seats on scroll carved front legs joined by carved stretchers £100-150



A large and impressive gilt-brass marble-topped Rococo revival console table, French, probably second half of the 19th century, with serpentine front and pierced guilloche frieze above a massive architectural monopodia scroll set with a mask of Athena and a billowing zephyr below, supported by an accanthus-draped hoof foot, 76 cm overall width x 42 cm deep x approximately 90 cm overall height. £400-500



A Victorian four-panel carved walnut boudoir/ modesty screen with arched crestings above split cane panels, set with oval hand-painted canvas studies in the manner of Gainsborough, flanked by barley twist columns, and fabric inset lower sections. 224 cm overall length x 204 cm overall height £200-300

In the manner of Thomas Chippendale, a well-carved low-backed library armchair, probably second half of the 20th century but faithfully worked, with deep buttoned leatherette upholstery, the arm supports with chinoiserie blind fretting, the well-drawn cabriole legs with bold "Dublin Shell" knee decoration, terminating in stylised dolphin feet, 79 cm overall width x 63 cm deep x 91 cm overall height. £300-400





A Regency style painted satinwood and cane panel five-piece salon suite, first quarter of the 20th century, the suite comprising two side chairs, two elbow chairs, and a two-seat settee, the cresting rails painted with harebell swags above split can backs and double-skinned arms, each back with an oval boss painted with musical trophies, above stuffover Damask fabric upholstery, on square tapering legs with spade feet, 102 cm width of settee.

A primitive birch and ash vernacular open armchair, probably 19th century Welsh, with a comb back, through construction and straight arms over a drop in woven sea grass seat on hewn legs united by turned rance. 48 cm wide x 61 cm deep x 96 cm overall height, with 37 cm to the seat, together with another probably North Western primitive ladder-back openarmchair and an Eastern Counties, 19th-century openarmchair in distinctive gingery oak. A Victorian walnut chiffonier with glazed serpentine end cupboards, the single central blind cupboard and frieze with decorative parquetry panels, fitted with gilt metal mounts throughout, on a shaped plinth base, 181 cm x 41 cm deep x 112 cm overall height. £300-500




A pair of escutcheon-backed mahogany writing/ library open armchairs, probably 1840s by Gillows (but apparently unmarked), to an earlier design, with distinctive shaped backs, shepherd's crook arms over a drop-in seat and anthemion carved legs terminating in claw and ball feet. 61 cm wide x 65 cm deep x 89 cm overall height.

A Regency and later secretaire chiffonier, with brass mouldings, grilles and sunken amboyna panels, the upper section with pleated silk panelled doors above a frieze drawer with inclining writing surface, and two conforming cupboard doors on architectural block feet, 92 cm wide x 43 cm deep x 135 cm overall height. £200-300



A pair of Victorian mahogany cartouche-topped parlour stools with stuffover upholstery above shaped aprons and slender moulded cabriole legs, 50 cm wide x 50 cm deep x 46 cm overall height.
