



 - Le Roy operated from Galerie Montpensier, 13-15 Palais-Royal, where they were to remain for nearly a hundred years. Le Roy was appointed a clockmaker to the Emperor Napoleon, amongst other prestigious clients. £1,500-2,000
- Brunelot (?), an oval cased hour repeating carriage alarm clock, the floral engraved case fitted a circular enamel Roman dial with subsidiary alarm dial below, both within an engine turned gilt brass mask, the movement chiming the hours and half as a passing strike, the movement bearing a "B" trademark, 18 cm high (handle up). £500-700
- Drocourt of Paris; a large 8-day, Gorge cased, hour repeating carriage clock, late 19th-century, fitted with a circular enamel Roman, within an engraved gilt brass mask and moon hands, the movement chiming the hours and half as a passing strike on a coil gong, numbered 16561 to both case and movement and key, with a Morocco leather case, 22 cm high (handle up). 








- 108 Drocourt of Paris, a large gorge-cased, hour repeating, 8-day carriage clock, the fine gilt case fitted with a single-piece enamel Roman dial, chiming the hours and half as a passing strike on a coil gong, numbered 8100, bearing the company logo, 25 cm high (handle up).
 - Pierre Drocourt, who specialised in high-quality carriage clocks. The company had its main workshops in the Saint-Nicolas-d'Aliermont area and a finishing workshop in Paris at 28 Rue de Limoges (later Rue Debelleyme). Pierre's son, Alfred, took over the business in the 1870s, and the firm continued to win prestigious awards for its decorative carriage clocks. £1,000-1,500
- 109 A Paris Corniche cased chiming carriage clock, with singlepiece enamelled Roman dial, fitted with gilt halberd hands. The movement chiming the hours and half as a passing strike on a domed bell, numbered 30952 to the movement and case 16.5 cm high. £150-250



- An oval cased carriage alarm clock, with a simple moulded case, fitted with a primary circular Arabic dial and alarm indicator below at 6 o'clock, within a granular gilt mask, the base with concealed large circular bell and capstan feet, accompanied by associated keys, 15 cm high (handle up). £200-300






